With these resources and methods at your fingertips, you can create or remodel properties to reduce their carbon footprint.

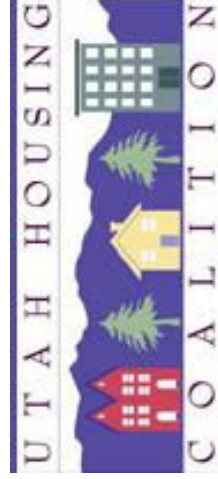
