



Goals of THE Academy

At the end of the 30-month period, all participating organizations as a group will achieve:

- 140 housing units in the development process
- 28 housing units rehabbed or built
- \$1.4 million in non-HUD financing
- \$700,000 of new/expanded federal funding

- Commitment to housing development, feasible plan for continued salary support for the project leads.
- Developed housing in the past 5 years, and attempted to leverage funding other than NAHASDA




